Red, White and Buda: Celebrate Independence Day the Buda Way

BUDA, TEXAS — The City’s annual celebration of the nation’s independence, **Red, White and Buda**, returns to downtown and **Buda Amphitheater and City Park** from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m., July 4, 2023. The musical performance line up will be announced soon.

Festivities begin at 9 a.m. Tuesday, July 4, with the traditional Bike Parade along Main Street. Awards will be given in various categories (i.e., best decorated, etc). Independence Day celebrations continue through the day with craft and food vendors, cornhole tournament, live music performances by Honeymooners and Austin 9, and a fireworks display to complete the event. Several downtown streets will be closed briefly for the parade [see parade route map below] but will reopen promptly after. Parking for the celebration will be available at Buda Amphitheater and City Park, Garrison Park on Garrison Road, Old Buda Elementary (lower-level lot) on RM-967, and Buda Municipal Complex at 405 E. Loop Street. Buda Police and Park Staff will enforce no-park zones.

The City of Buda is home to about 18,000 residents and has earned designations as a “Texas Main Street City,” “Tree City USA,” “Bee City Affiliate” and “Platinum Level Scenic City.” Buda, the Outdoor Capitol of Texas, is situated along the Interstate 35 corridor in Hays County, has 14 parks and a historic downtown district where residents and visitors alike can shop, dine, relax, and *breathe easy here*.
